### I. Basic Program Data

### I.1 Name of the project

Musical Instrument Acquisition Program for the Church of God in Christ of Haiti-STEP 1

#### I.2 Goal

To get the necessary instruments in order to contribute to the advancement of the mission by supervising young people and orienting their talents towards a systematic program of musical and orchestral education.

#### I.3 Branches

The program embraces three specific branches.

- a. Worship and praise
- b. Philarmonic orchestra
- c. Fanfare (Brass band)

#### I.4 Steps

The program must take place in several steps.

The step 1 concerns the Mother Church of the Mission (Haiti's first Church of God in Christ).

The other churches will be taken into account with the implementation of the next steps.

#### II. General framework

#### II.1 Purpose of the program

The purpose of the Program is to contribute to the advancement of the Church by orienting young people towards a systematic program of musical and orchestral education and to enable them to take advantage of their inherent strengths and talents and develop the intrinsic musical abilities of every mission's church. This goal will be achieved by the acquisition of all kinds of musical instruments related to the three concerned components (Worship and Praise, Philharmonic Orchestra and

Fanfare) and by the implementation of a systematic program of orchestral education that will come to add to the regular arrangements of education by resorting to music education as a complement to the intellectual and cultural growth of young Christians in the mission.

The Program aims to contribute to the development of the Church by hinstilling in the young people the civic, moral and spiritual values.

### II.2 Components of the program.

The program develops in three components:

- 1) Acquisition of musical instruments
- 2) Musical training
- 3) Repair and maintenance of defective instruments.

### II.2.1 Acquisition of musical instruments to equip young people

The Church of God in Christ mission in Haiti has many churches. Some of these churches are poorly equipped musically. Others do not have any instruments.

Considering that a musical accompaniment is important to help leading the people of God to adoration, the headquarters of the Mission directed by Bishop Leon D. Pamphile embarks on the present program to equip the various churches of the Mission with instruments necessary for their operation. However, the first step of the project concerns the HQ Church. The upcoming launch of the other steps will take into account the other churches that will benefit from the program. The list of instruments needed to carry out the first step is further down in this document.

#### II.2.2 Student musical training

The program aims to improve the church's music education center by implementing a pioneering educational method suited to young people. This instruction simultaneously integrates theory, practice and instrumental and orchestral performance from the beginning of the training.

This work must ensure that participants become part of the Church's activities as soon as they register. Students are collectively committed to ensuring compulsory music coverage of the various cults and programs of the local church. The Program's method ensures early and continuous exposure to major musical works, and seeks continuous contact between the recipient and his home community.

#### II.2.3 Repair and maintenance of defective instruments

The headquarters of the Church of God in Christ in Haiti has the "Musical Instruments Maintenance and Repair Center" (MIMRC). For many years this center has been repairing the defective instruments of the church. This has made it possible to extend the life of the few instruments available bearing in mind that the acquisition of new instruments has never been easy. Thanks to the MIMRC the Church of God in Christ is ready to receive all kinds of instruments from its donors, whether new, used or even defective. The center will be able to make them functional.


